OBITUARY OF MRS. RASMUS JORGENSEN

Dacobine Johanne Hansen was born in Klakring, near Honsens, Denmark on November 24, 1846. There she grew to womanhood, and at the age of 22 years she married Rasmus Jorgensen, a young man of the neighboring vicinity. To this union ten children were born, four of whom have preceded her in dealth. Two died in infancy, a son, Thorvald, passed away at the age of 14 years, and a daughter, Tillie, (Mrs. Peter Petersen) died during the flu epedemic in 1919.

As Mrs. Jorgensen was all her life a very ambitious woman and of a loving and sympathetic nature, she decided during her early married life to take up the study of midwifery. She graduated from the Royal School of Midwifery in Copenhagen in 1878 and henceforth practiced her profession for more than forty years, first in Denmark and later in this country.

Mr. and Mrs. Jorgensen, believing that the New Land with its great open spaces offered greater opportunities for their children than the densely populated land of their birth, immigrated to America in 1892 and settled down on a farm six miles west of Viborg. There they remained until 26 years ago, when they retired from the farm and moved to Viborg.

In June 1914 Mr. Jorgensen was called to the great beyond, and Mrs. Jorgensen was left alone with her children and a large circle of devoted friends.

Mrs. Jorgensen thoroughly enjoyed life and good health until two years ago, when she through an accident suffered a broken hip. Since then her health has been gradually failing, and after several weeks of intense suffering, death came as a kind reaper to relieve her of her earthly struggles, on December 1st, 1935. She was at the time of her death 89 years and seven days old.

Mrs. Jorgensen leaves to mourn ther death four sons, Sofus Jorgensen, Molde, Norway, C. J. Glood, Viborg, S. D.; N. A. Jorgensen, Sciem, S. D.; and C. M. Jorgensen of near Viborg, and two daughters, Mrs. C. T. S. Goodhope of Viborg, S. D., and Mrs. A. R. Olsen of Sicux Falls, S. D., beside, their families, her grandchildren and greatgrandchildren, and a host of friends. She was buried from the South Lutheren church on Wednesday, December 4. Rev. Harris Jespersen officiating.
