Funeral Services Held For Mrs. William Haines

Funeral services for Mrs. Edna Haines, Hurley, who was killed instantly in an auto accident Saturday, Oct. 18, were held at St. Christina's Catholic Church in Parker, S. Dak., on Tuesday morning, at 10 o'clock with Father Paul J. Carroll officiating. Honorary bearers were Enoch Breen, Otto Paulson, Louie B. Christensen, William Spomer, Elmer Johnson, and Roy DeNeui. Casket bearers were Gilbert Ruden, Lyle Hummel, Virgil Nelson, Arden Gerdes, Vincent Van Erem and Dr. Thomas Ryan. She was laid to rest in the Hurley Cemetery.

Edna Fisher was born March 10, 1892, near Wakonda to Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Fisher. She married William Hanes on Oct. 22, 1914, at Wakonda. Following their marriage they lived on a farm near Wilmont, Minn., where their oldest son, William Joseph, was born. They later farmed in the Centerville area, then moved to the Hurley area in 1937. They moved into Hurley in 1950 where they have lived ever since.

Survivors include her husband, William; three daughters, Mrs. Dan Young of Vermillion, Mrs. Newton Jensen of Centerville, and Mrs. Leland Paulson of Viborg; a son, John of Hurley; two sisters, Mrs. Joe Wathier of Centerville and Mrs. Lewis Nelson of Yankton; eight grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her parents; one son, William, who was killed in action during World War II; a sister, and three brothers.

Mrs. Haines was an active member of the American Legion Auxiliary Post No. 21, Hurley.
